HOW DO I GET STARTED?

- Apply to the college
- Have previous coursework transferred
- If you are a first time student, you must sit for the Accuplacer test (see exemptions on the Trenholm website.
- ACT
 - Sit for the ACT and score 18 or greater.
 Visit act.org to register. OR
 - Have your official ACT score sent to the admissions office.
- The Radiology Program is a selective admission program.
- Minimum requirements to apply:
 - 18 or higher on ACT
 - 2.5 GPA (calculated on the most recent 24 credit hours)
 - Eligibility to place into ENG 101, MTH 100 and BIO 201 by the application deadline. (Note: BIO 103 is a prerequisite to BIO 201)
- Meeting minimum requirements and completing a program application does not ensure admission to the program.
- All applicants will be ranked according to composite ACT score with 1 additional point being awarded for any of the corequisite courses completed with a C or better. Tie breaker information: 1st: Math ACT score; 2nd: science ACT score; 3rd: reading ACT score; 4th: GPA on the most recent 24 credit hours.
- Note: All general education requirements for the RAD Program are co-requisite courses and do NOT have to completed to be eligible to apply.

ESTIMATED LENGTH AND COST

- Associate Degree
 - 5 semesters (76 credit hours)
- Tuition and Fees \$12,160
- Books \$ 1197 may vary among suppliers
- Uniforms/Supplies/Misc. \$750
- Tax not included. Prices are subject to change without prior notice.
- General education course taken before admission to the program will alter the program length.

WHEN AND HOW CAN I APPLY?

- The RAD Program accepts a class annually.
- Applications will be located on the RAD webpage during open application time only and requires the following::
 - A completed application/Essential Eligibility Criteria Form.
 - ACT score showing in the MyTrenholm Portal
 - Unofficial transcripts from all colleges emailed to program faculty.
 - Official transcripts from all colleges sent to admissions.
- The number of students accepted is based on clinical availability.
- The program is 5 semesters in length once accepted and is typically Monday-Friday.
- Co-requisite courses may be completed in advance:
 - o MTH 100
 - o BIO 201
 - o BIO 202
 - o ENG 101
 - o ORI 101
 - o PSY 200
 - HUMANITIES ELECTIVE
 - Choose from 1 of the following:
 - ENG 102
 - SPH 106
 - SPH 107
 - **Note: BIO 103 is a pre-requisite course for BIO 201.
